## Chief Deanna Cantrell

#### named as Sandra Stelter Leadership Award

Deanna started with the San Luis Obispo Police Department as the Chief of Police on January 4, 2016. Prior to this appointment, she was with the Mesa, Arizona Police Department for 21 years, with her last assignment as the Assistant Chief of the Administrative Services Bureau where she oversaw Fiscal, Supply, Fleet, Police Information Technology, Communications, Records and the Forensics Lab. Deanna served as the Deputy Chief of Special Operations, Patrol Commander, Internal Affairs Lieutenant and Sergeant, Gang and Patrol Lieutenant, and many other positions within the police department, including time spent as a Motor officer in Traffic and several Special Operations positions

Chief Deanna Cantrell became Fairfield's Chief of Police on October 14, 2020. She was sworn in as the first female chief in Fairfield's history, and as the 13th Chief to lead Fairfield PD.

Chief Cantrell most recently served as the Chief of Police at the San Luis Obispo Police Department. Prior to San Luis Obispo, Chief Cantrell served the City of Mesa, Arizona, as Assistant Chief for over 21 years. During her tenure, she had fiscal oversight of fleet, supply, police information technology, communications, records, and the forensics labs. She also served as the Deputy Chief of special operations, patrol commander, internal affairs lieutenant and sergeant, gang and patrol lieutenant, motor officer, and several other special operations positions.

### **Maddame Wilson Wins:**

#### Bayard Rustin Award for Social Change

SACRAMENTO, Calif. — As a response to the over 300 anti-LGBTQ bills that have been introduced this year across the nation, lawmakers want to make California a sanctuary state for the LGBTQ community.

A lawmaker leading the charge for LGBTQ freedom in the Golden State is Assemblymember Lori Wilson (D-Fairfield), who became the first lawmaker in California to be the parent of a transgender person.

"That didn't even cross my mind as something that was like to be thought of as a big deal until people within the community, LGBTQ+ community, started to make a note of it and come talk to me about how important for them it was," Wilson said.

Wilson shared her family's experience during her son's transition, and the important steps taken to help the process.


"We did therapy as a family and with him just to give him space to figure out what it was and eventually he did receive gender-affirming care, both through therapy and surgically," Wilson said.


Wilson credits living in California as a reason for her son to transition with no outside interference, unlike other states in the nation. Wilson used Texas as an example of a state where transgender people cannot transition as freely.


# "Shantay, You Stay," says locals.
